

Good Communication between Conferences.

Did you know? Conferences may help anyone, but if they help someone from within another conference's boundaries, they should work with that conference to determine the help to be given and protect against duplication of services.

Unfortunately, in some circumstances the communication between conferences involves a patron that raises some concerns. In this case, there are two methods to alert other conferences, and you may use both. First, contact Bonnie at the Council office to send an "alert" email to other conference officers to contact your conference about a particular patron. Second, the records in Thiftworks/Cares include an alert function that will be highlighted in the patron's record.

Patron Grant Fund

The Patron Grant Fund Program provides grants to neighbors in need in four categories: Rehabilitation Treatment, Health Treatment, Job Training, and Education. These 4 areas are defined broadly. Do not hesitate to ask an individual's goal and possible eligibility to participate in the Patron Grant Program.

As you do your Home Visits, keep your eyes and ears open. Your next visit could be the person with a goal that seems unreachable to them. The Patron Grant Fund could be the answer to help them along in their journey to improve their situation. The next Patron Grant Fund Advisory Board meeting will be in September to review any applications that are submitted. **Applications are due no later than September 1**. Electronic Voucher Updates

MATTRESS PRICE CHANGES: Effective August 1, the costs for both the mattresses and platforms have changed, but while the mattresses have increased slightly, the platforms have decreased resulting in an overall lower cost for the set for Full & Queen sizes! Twins remain the same price. Speaking of mattresses, store management asks that you try not to include delivery on a voucher for just a twin mattress and/or platform. These are small enough to fit in any car and the delivery cost means we lose money on the transaction. Ask the patron if they have a friend who can help pick it up, or possibly a conference team would consider doing so.

Please print out the attached Categories & Values Sheet to use the current pricing. And don't forget there is a Cliff Notes version of Voucher Instructions on the back side of the sheet. Basic voucher entry mistakes continue to happen so please review them to refresh your memory. Thank you.
